### Purchases made for the hospital

Over the past year we agreed to the following funding for the hospital:

In January 2021 we agreed £883.99 for a Bariatric Wheelchair for Podiatric Out Patients Department In March 2021 we agreed £192 for a self propelled wheelchair of Minor Injuries Unit

In May 2021 we agreed to £1236 for the purchase of benches to be placed outside MIU for patients to wait. In June 2021 we agreed to the funding of £272 for the purchase of art materials and games for Fettle Rehabilitation Services.

In September 2021 we agreed to funding of £150 for the purchase of a vacuum cleaner and various cleaning materials for Bowman Ward for rehabilitation use.

In November 21 we agreed to funding of £6000 to go towards the cost of three Rempods (Reminiscence Pods) for Harbour Ward, that is a train, a potting shed and a Vintage Tea Room. Sister Julie Mackinnon had previously invited members of the committee to visit the ward to make it easier to envisage what she had in mind.

In January 2022 we agreed to funding of £264 for 12 Food Safety and Hygiene level 2 courses for patients on Bowman Ward
