In February, the Friends of Pencarrow and the Molesworth-St Aubyn Family invited Bodmin Hospital League of Friends to be one of the charities to benefit from Snowdrop Weekend. Committee news

At our AGM in November we were delighted that Jonathan Coode DL consented to become our President after the loss of Lady Iona. Jonathan's wife Judy had initiated the Bodmin Hospital Fete and had run it for many years. Accepting the position he said 'I feel very honoured, following in the footsteps of a great, great lady who will be such hard act to follow. I will do what I can but I think I will fail'. Far from it - he is the most wonderful and supportive President.

We were sad that long serving Committee Member and Trustee, Keith Searle, had stood down

We continue to held monthly meetings, normally on the first Thursday of the month, at the One and All Community Hall in Lanviet which, apart from not being in the hospital, is the most wonderful venue – many thanks to all the staff there.

Purchases made for the hospital

Over the past year we agreed to the following funding for the hospital:

In February 2023: we funded £2880 for Bowman Ward to replace the greenhouse which had originally been installed when the Healing Garden was created in 2008.

In May 2023: £494 for Harvest Ward for a television and a Karaoke Machine which, we subsequently heard from the ward about how well the Karaoke machine had been used over Christmas, saying 'the League of Friends have made some patients on Harvest Ward very happy over Christmas!'

In September 2023: £117.15 to purchase for the Woodfield Stroke Rehabilitation Unit a Biozoom Air Flavoured device which creates a froth of various flavours, coffee for example, to enable a sense of taste for those who have lost the ability to swallow

In October 2023: £4.750 for purchase of airwaye

In October 2023: £4,750 for purchase of airwave mattresses for Anchor and Harbour CATU (Community Assessment and Treatment Unit)

Also in October 23: £228.65 for Out Patients Dept to purchase a Wall Activity Centre and Wall stickers to make the Children's waiting area more child friendly. In December as always, we supply cash for the staff to buy a present for each patient who is in hospital over Christmas – this is always very warmly received In march 24 we agreed to funding of £375.07 to purchase items for two Self Soothe Boxes for the East Cornwall Home Treatment Team.

Also in March 24 we agreed to a request from Matron Denise Williams for £5208.15 to purchase and install a proper Reception Desk at the hospital entrance, More news on this once it is in place.
